Please invite your friends and family to attend this presentation on the Vatican Splendors exhibit currently on display at the Ronald Reagan Library. The presentation is open to the public

On Saturday, July 23, 2016 we will meet at the Ronald Reagan Library in Simi Valley, at 9:30 AM for a “Once in a lifetime experience”, to see more than 200 pieces of Vatican art and some never-before-seen works, even some not seen in the Vatican.

The Council of Trent (1545-1563) established guidelines that art should be created in the service of faith and to deliver the message of Christianity in ways accessible to ordinary people. Art became part of the liturgy, and through missionary work the Church was enriched with devotional art of diverse cultures.

“In order to communicate the message entrusted to her by Christ, the Church needs art. Art must make perceptible, and as far as possible attractive, the world of the spirit, of the invisible, of God. It must therefore translate into meaningful terms that which is in itself ineffable. Art has a unique capacity to take one or other facet of the message and translate it into colors, shapes and sounds which nourish the intuition of those who look or listen. It does so without emptying the message itself of its transcendent value and its aura of mystery.” — Pope John Paul II in his Letter to Artists, 1999
