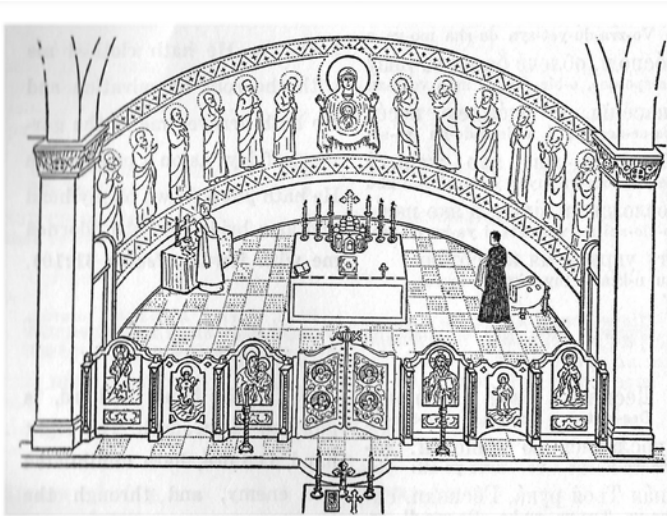

A MEDITATION ON TODAY’S GOSPEL

In the gospel today, Jesus teaches that if our eyes are diseased, the result will be that our bodies will become

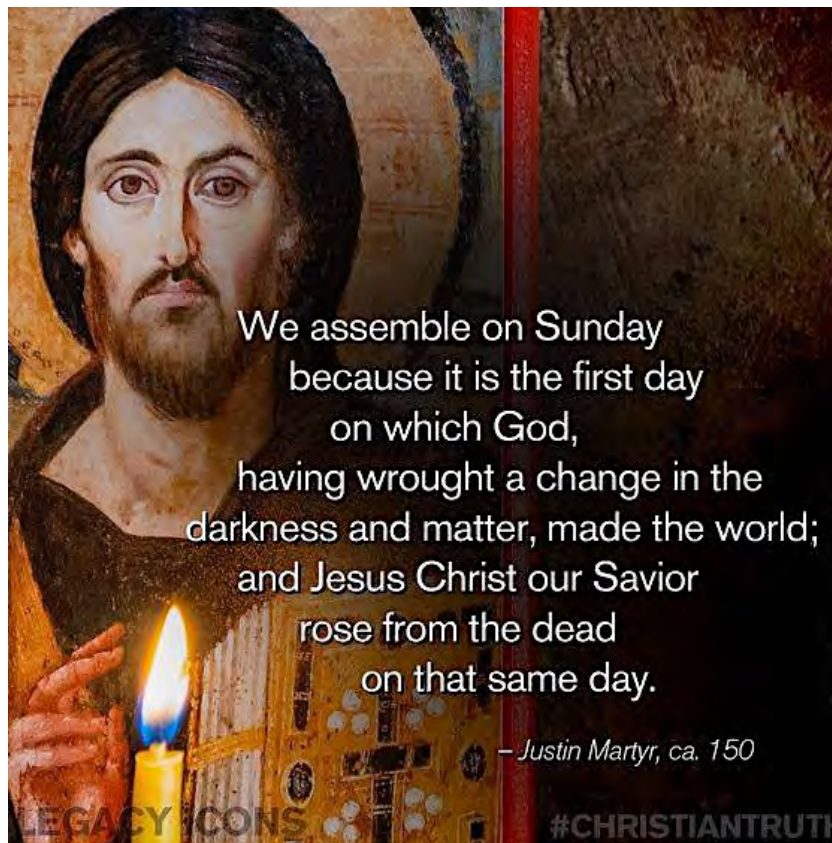
dark. These words of Jesus have a spiritual meaning. For instance, the word “eye” signifies something spiritual. The eye is truly the window to our mind. Scientists state that minds gather up almost all of its sense data from the use of the eyes. One doctor reported that eighty percent of all sense information that feeds the brain by the five senses comes from the eyes. The human mind, in turn, controls the eyes. We can open or close our eyes. We can choose to look at evil things such as pornography or we can decide to cast our eyes on something good, such as icons or holy objects.

It would be wise if we use our eyes for God. We must let the light of Christ enter into our souls and minds. There are too many people using their eyes for evil. They search and seek out things of darkness. They refuse to let the light of Christ fill their hearts. Consequently, they become beings of darkness.

In the book, *Gems from the Sunday Gospels*, the author, Anthony Conaris relates to us a thoughtful story:

“On a tour of the Swill Alps, the tour guide was pointing out the spectacular beauty of the snow-capped peaks, the bubbling mountain streams, the mirror-like lakes and the majestic skyline. One unappreciative heckler kept saying, “What is so wonderful about that?” The tour guide quickly replied, “Man, if you haven’t got it on the inside, you’ll not see it on the outside.”

This story tells it all. Our insides, our wills, our desires, and our passions must be lightened by the radiance of the Holy Spirit. Thus, today we have learned that we
