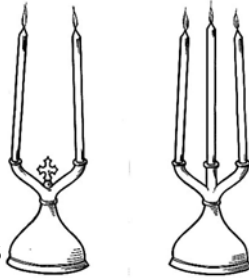

Then the bishop gives a lighted candle to the candidate. The candidate then takes it and kisses the candle and the hand of the bishop.

Bishop: O Lord, you have enlightened all creation with the light of your wonders. You know all human designs and intentions before they are formed, and strengthen those who desire to serve you. Adorn your servant (name), who has chosen to carry a candle before your holy mysteries, with your pure and spotless garment, that shining with light, he may greet you in the age to come and receive the incorruptible crown of life, rejoicing with the elect in eternal happiness. For holy and glorified is your most honored and magnificent name, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, now and ever and forever.

Response: Amen.

The candidate, standing with the candle in his hands, chants:

Troparion—*St. Basil the Great's Liturgy*

Your voice resounds to the whole world which has received your word of instruction in divine dogmas. You explained the nature of creation and gave rules to order human conduct. O royal priest, O venerable father Basil, beg Christ our God to grant his great mercy.

Troparion—*St. John Chrysostom's Liturgy*

The grace shining forth from your mouth like a torch has enlightened the universe; it has stored up in the world the treasure of disdain for wealth. It has showed us the heights of humility. Instruct us by your words, John Chrysostom, our father, and intercede with the Word, Christ God, to save our souls.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

Kondakion—*St. Gregory's Presanctified Liturgy*

Your theology like a shepherd's flute has overcome the trumpet blasts of orators. As you have searched the depths of the Spirit, beauty of speech was also given to you. Father Gregory, now pray to Christ our God to save our souls.

Theotokion—*Mary the Mother of God*

Now and ever and forever. Amen.

Through the prayers of all the Saints and of the Theotokos, grant us, O Lord, your peace and have mercy on us, for you alone are gracious.

Then the candidate approaches to receive tonsure, and the Bishop, taking the scissors, cuts some hair in the form of a cross from the candidate's head, saying:

Bishop: The hair of the head of the servant of God (name) is cut in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Then the Bishop places the short phelonion on the candidate and again, with his hand, signs his head three times in the form of the cross. Laying his hand on his head, he prays:

Bishop: Lord God Almighty, choose this your servant (name) and sanctify him. Make him worthy, with all wisdom and understanding, to study and read your divine word, and keep his life blameless. Through the mercy, kindness, and love of your only-begotten Son with whom you are blessed, together with your all-holy, good, and life-creating Spirit, now and ever and forever.

Response: Amen.

Then the bishop gives the Book of the Epistles to the reader who, upon receiving it, kisses the book and the bishop's right hand.

The reader goes to the middle of the church.

The subdiaconate takes place immediately following the ordination to the other minor orders, then, after the singing of "Axios," the Bishop, standing on the orlets in the middle of the church, vests the candidate with the orarion of the sticharion. He makes the sign of the cross over it, and the candidate kisses the orarion and the hand of the Bishop, who then vests him in it cross-wise. The candidate kneels facing the Bishop who is facing East and who then signs the head of the candidate three times.

Bishop: Lord our God, through the one and the same Holy Spirit you distribute your graces to everyone you have chosen. You have bestowed various orders upon your Church, and have established different degrees of ministry for the service of your holy and pure mysteries. In your ineffable foreknowledge, you have appointed your servant (name) worthy to minister to your holy Church. Master, keep him blameless in everything, and grant that he may love the beauty of your house, stand at the doors of your holy church, and light the candles of the dwelling of your glory. Plant him in your Church as a fruitful olive tree bearing the fruits of righteousness. Show your servant to be perfect, that at the time of your coming, he may receive the reward of those pleasing to you. For yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, now and ever and forever.

Response: Amen.

A Litany is chanted with responses. Lord, have mercy.

THEN

The candidate rises and a basin, a pitcher with water, and a long towel are brought forward. The Bishop first takes the towel and places it on the shoulders of the newly ordained. The Bishop then gives him the basin, which the subdeacon receives, and he kisses the basin, the pitcher with water, and the hand of the Bishop.

He then washes the Bishop's hands saying three times: "All you faithful."

The Bishop thus washes his hands. Then he blesses with the hand, and covers the whole head of the newly ordained with the towel, and orders him to be led to the appointed place usually in front of the icon of Christ on the icon screen.
