“Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute you and utter every kind of evil against you falsely because of me. Rejoice and be glad for your reward will be great in heaven.”

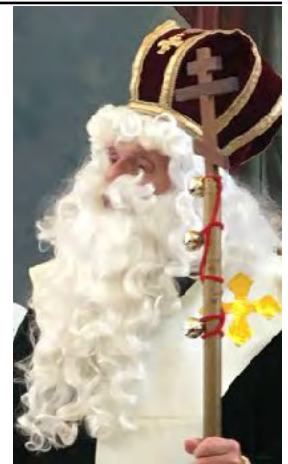
Have we suffered because of our faith and for following our Lord, Jesus Christ?
