FIFTH SUNDAY OF GREAT LENT**Exegesis of the Gospel, Mk 10:32-45**

Jesus warns his puzzled and frightened disciples that rejection, suffering and death lie ahead of them in Jerusalem (10:32-34). The disciples' inability or unwillingness to hear this disturbing word is evident from the actions of two of Jesus' closest and most trusted followers, James and John, the Sons of Zebedee. Despite Jesus' words, the two brothers believe that Jesus is entering a new and glorious stage of his career that will be marked by his assumption of regal glory. They want to ensure that they will have appropriately important positions in Jesus' kingdom.

How far off the mark these two are is evident from Jesus' exasperated response: "You don't know what you are asking!" (10:38). Jesus asks them if they are ready to share his real fate.

They affirm that they are. Christ's triumph will be inaugurated by his suffering; that of the disciples will follow that same path. For Jesus it was especially important that those who are the foundation of his community of faith learn that they cannot imitate the style of those in the power structures of this world. They are called to serve. Of course, the example for their pattern of leadership is Christ himself. The purpose of Jesus' ministry was to give his life for others as the servant of the Lord whose obedience is redemptive. The paradox is that Jesus' death will be the revelation of the divine grace and power which save the world.
