To visit the church use the doors on the North side of the church. MASKS are mandated for everyone on the church property and in the church. Singing is allowed outside the church building. Church bell ringing will be short so as to not overwhelm our participation in the outdoor liturgy.

The Gospel of the Loaves and the Fishes

Matthew 14:14

COMPASSION = The Greek "splanchnizomai" (Strong's #G4697) means "to have deep compassion or pity."

HEALED = The Greek "therapeuo" (Strong's #G2323), from which we get the English word "therapy" means "to wait upon, serve, heal, relieve, cure."

Matthew 14:15

AS EVENING APPROACHED = Later afternoon around 6 pm. Most people hurried home before sunset, however their needs were so great and Jesus was so compassionate that the people lingered after sunset.

THE DISCIPLES CAME TO HIM ... AND SAID ...

IT'S ALREADY GETTING LATE = The disciples were ministering with one eye on the clock and were eager to get rid of the crowds.

SEND THE CROWDS AWAY SO ... THEY CAN ...

BUY THEMSELVES SOME FOOD = The disciples uncaring attitude was concealed in words calculated to

make Jesus think they were genuinely concerned about the people's needs (see Matthew 14:16).

Matthew 14:16

THEY DO NOT NEED TO GO AWAY = With this gentle rebuke Jesus revealed He saw through the disciples ruse and knew the real reason they wanted to send the people away.

YOU GIVE THEM SOMETHING TO EAT = Here Jesus called his disciples from ministry governed by the clock to real, unselfish ministry requiring all they had to offer.

Matthew 14:17

WE HAVE HERE ONLY FIVE LOAVES OF BREAD AND TWO FISH = The disciples were still reluctant to become involved in a personally sacrificial ministry inspired by genuine compassion and faith.

Matthew 14:18

BRING THEM HERE TO ME = Whatever is available in our hand to minister to others will be sufficient through God's blessing.

Matthew 14:19

HE DIRECTED THE PEOPLE TO SIT DOWN ON THE GRASS = Apparently the men were seated apart from the women and children in accordance with Jewish custom (Matthew 14:21).

HE GAVE THANKS = The Jewish grace said before meals was: Blessed are You, Jehovah our God, King of the universe, who brings forth bread from the earth."

HE GAVE THEM TO THE DISCIPLES = Whatever we receive from the hand of Christ is more than sufficient to meet the needs of His people (Matthew 14:20).

AND THE DISCIPLES GAVE THEM TO THE PEOPLE = Here is seen the importance of doing God's work in an orderly fashion.

Matthew 14:20

ALL ATE AND WERE SATISFIED ... TWELVE BASKETFULS OF BROKEN PIECES THAT WERE LEFT OVER = Here we see two truths: (1) What came from the hand of Christ was more than sufficient to meet the needs of His people; (2) Nothing that comes from Christ should be discarded and wasted. Instead the bounty is to be gathered up and shared.

Matthew 14:21

FIVE THOUSAND MEN, BESIDE WOMEN AND CHILDREN = Jews did not permit women and children to eat with men in public, so they were fed in a place by themselves.

Matthew 14:22

JESUS MADE THE DISCIPLES GET INTO THE BOAT = Here we see the truth illustrated that Jesus does not always send us into safe paths in Christian ministry. At times it is his will to send his disciples into danger. As we obey his command we can always know whether in peril or in safety we are under his saving care.

GO ON AHEAD OF HIM TO THE OTHER SIDE = The disciples had their eye on the clock and were in a hurry to leave (Matthew 14:15). The north end of the Sea of Galilee is only about four miles wide at this point. Since this occurred at Passover time, there was a full moon because Passover always occurs during a full moon.
