6th Sunday after Pentecost

A Meditation on Today's Gospel

In today's Gospel story, we see that there was a paralytic in search of a cure for his paralysis.

He probably looked for many years for a cure of his ailment. Finally, his friends saw Jesus teaching the crowds and they picked up the paralytic and placed him in front of Jesus. They were hoping that Jesus would cure their friend's paralysis. But Jesus had something else in mind. He said to the paralyzed man: "Take heart man! Your sins are forgiven you." Following this, Jesus orders the paralytic to rise and pick up his pallet. The question that comes to mind is, why did Jesus wait to cure him?

The reason why Jesus delayed in curing the paralytic man is because the cure of spiritual illnesses is much more important in the eyes of Jesus than the cure of bodily diseases. In fact, Jesus teaches that the forgiveness of sins is a more difficult action to perform than curing bodily diseases. In reflection, we see that it is more important to be concerned with the health of our souls than the welfare of our bodies. The paralytic should have asked Jesus to cure his spiritual problems first. Do we sometimes act like the paralytic? Are we too concerned for our bodies rather than the spiritual health of our souls? Are we aware that we can experience spiritual diseases within?

Finally, let us today be more conscious of our spiritual welfare in our journey through life. For we must remember this simple fact of life: the body will die and corrupt while the soul lives forever. It would be wise to center our desires on the eternal realities instead of temporal things. The eternal life in heaven is the great gift that Jesus is offering to you. The eternal place of torment, or hell, is for those who love the temporal things of the world over the Lord. So let us today start thinking about God and His gift of eternal life.
